

## Call for Association for Mentoring and Inclusion in Economics (AMIE) Mentors for 2026-2027

AMIE's mentoring program provides guidance to Ph.D. students in economics, public policy, applied economics, and agricultural economics—based in any country. It focuses on supporting students who may face barriers to academic advancement, including (but not limited to) those who have limited access to elite academic networks, are the first in their families to attend college, or who come from a wide range of educational or socio-economic backgrounds. We welcome applications from all interested students.

AMIE will continue with the mentoring program for the year 2026-2027 and is looking for kind and generous mentors to help with the mentoring initiative.

### Who Can Be an AMIE Mentor?

- Anyone who holds a Ph.D. in economics/public policy/applied economics/agricultural economics (for example, tenure-track/tenured faculty in an academic institution; economists in research organizations/think tanks; governments, NGOs, private sector; and consulting), and who is excited to support and nurture the next generation of economists.
- A minimum commitment of one academic year (roughly 12-15 hours in a year).
